Sarika Sinha is a trailblazing feminist activist and trainer with over two decades of experience in grassroots and policy work. She is currently leading the Global Women's Leadership Program at the Coady Institute, Canada, and has been a part of the autonomous women's movement in India. She was most recently one of the Directors of ActionAid International and a lead on Women's Rights, working with marginalized communities including indigenous people facing starvation, caste-based sex workers, manual scavengers, and children in difficult circumstances.

Sarika Sinha is MSc in Gender, Development and Globalization from the London School of Economics, and holds a Post Graduate Diploma in Forestry Management (1999–2001) from the Indian Institute of Forest Management, Bhopal. She is a Chevening Scholar from India (2018). Her international courses include SANGAT: Course on Feminist, Human Rights and Globalization in Nepal (2007); International Visitor Leadership Programme, Government of US (2012); and the International Course on Sexuality by CREA, Turkey (2012).

Her awards and achievements include being felicitated and featured on Satyamev Jayte and WE the People (April 2019); among the top three in India in CBSE board exams; GOI/NCERT/State level scholarship holder; MoEF scholarship holder at PG level; and Chevening Scholar at Masters Level.

She has served on several governmental platforms and commissions in India including the Women's Committee of the Governor of Madhya Pradesh, State Secretariat of Madhya Pradesh, AIIMS, and Border Security Force. She played a key role in drafting policies, and in rolling out primary health care workers and One-Stop Crisis Centres across India.

Her international networks include Trainer of SANGAT and member of the feminist alliance across South Asia; Member of the One Billion Rising International Secretariat; Core member of Progressive International; Steering Committee member of the Women's Regional Network; and Member of the International Thematic Women's Rights Group in ActionAid International.

Her publications include *Rationalization of Health Sector in Chhattisgarh*; *Hashiye ki Awaaz* (four volumes); *Dwindling in the Drought*; *Towards a Central Act – Witchbranding*; and *Status of the Implementation of the Anti-Domestic Violence Act in MP*.

Her work experience includes Programme Officer (2004–2007), Programme Manager (2007–2008), Regional Manager (2008–2018) with ActionAid International India, and she has worked as the National Director, Policy, Campaigns and Communications in ActionAid Association.
